



**SQ PTSA Meeting

Meeting called to order at 7:02pm

Treasurer: Julie Brimm reported that checks are being distributed to each PTSA rep who will need them.

Class Committees:

- 2021 – Deanne reported that there are still a few outstanding senior goodie bags that students haven't picked up yet. Pam and Deanne did a fantastic job of getting these ready and distributed. Storm plush blankets are still for sale. The next class call is being scheduled. There will be no greenery or poinsettia sales this year. Josh McCudden has offered to handle finances for the committee.
